My Halliwick Story ... by Martyn Saville

Hi, I'm Martyn and I've been the Treasurer of Halliwick AST since 2019.

I work in financial services and also spent four years running my employer's staff disability network; when the role of Halliwick AST Treasurer came up, it was probably inevitable that I would get a tap on the shoulder! Many of you will have first-hand experience of how these things happen - if you know someone who is active in Halliwick, whether that is part of Halliwick AST, your regional Halliwick ASTRA or your local club, at some point you will be 'encouraged' to get involved.

My Halliwick AST Treasurer role is pretty straightforward - I take money in, pay our bills, check that publications orders have been paid for, prepare the annual accounts for Halliwick AST, apply for grants, keep the Charity Commission happy, that sort of thing. It is maybe not the most glamorous role, but if I do it properly it helps Halliwick AST to run smoothly, and to support the hundreds of Halliwick volunteers who provide disabled swimmers with such valuable experiences in the water. I also get to work with a great bunch of people on the Halliwick AST Executive Committee - all of them sharing their time, energy and experience to support, protect and build the Halliwick family and the activities it provides.

Alongside my role as Treasurer, I try to be a helpful pair of hands, ready to get stuck in where needed.



Sometimes that's driving duties (including a last-minute drive from London to Ebbw Vale for the National Gala when the coach company sent an inaccessible bus!), and other times it's helping poolside at Halliwick ASTRA 1 and at National Championships, putting out chairs and tables for Halliwick Penguins SC's AGM, ironing green teeshirts for Halliwick gala officials and volunteers, hunting down trophies, and all those other tasks that so many of you do week in, week out.

If you take away one message from my ramblings above, it is that there are lots of ways to get involved in Halliwick, both in and out of the water go on, get stuck in. I am really glad I did!

Four Halliwick ASTRAs (regions) took part: Halliwick ASTRA 1 (Greater London—North of the River Thames); Halliwick ASTRA 2 (Greater London—South of the River Thames, Kent Surrey and Sussex); Halliwick ASTRA 8 (Cheshire, Staffordshire and Shropshire); and Halliwick ASTRA 15 (Wales).

We Will Miss You

We were so sorry to hear of the passing of three Halliwick people recently:

Beryl Kelsey, Senior Halliwick Lecturer and IHA Emeritus Lecturer, sadly passed away on 18/08/2024. Beryl did an enormous amount for Halliwick, over many decades, locally, regionally, nationally and internationality. Not least, Beryl was a key member of the Executive and Education Committees of Halliwick AST.

Tom Brown sadly passed away on 25/09/2024. Tom gave a huge amount to Halliwick as, amongst other things, one of the 'Custodians of Halliwick' and a founder member of the Education Committee, as well as being a Senior Halliwick Lecturer.

Glyn Harris sadly passed away on 22/11/2024. Glyn was one of the original founders of the Rhondda Polar Bears Disabled Swimming Club in Halliwick ASTRA 15 (Wales), and had, amongst other things, been the club coach for over 40 years.

They will all be greatly missed, and we send our sincere condolences to their respective families and friends, including many within Halliwick.
